Greetings from the Loving Lab!

Our Study Thus Far

Thanks to everyone for your active participation over the past year and a half. We are almost finished with UT-DATES...only a few months before we wrap it up! We will begin analyzing all of our great data next semester and start publishing our results shortly thereafter.

We have a few more participants to bring into the laboratory over the next three months. So, we will contact you soon if you have yet to come in for your laboratory session. To all of our current participants, we greatly appreciate you continuing to complete your bi-weekly surveys!

65 participants are currently enrolled in UT-DATES, and 135 participants have now completed the study. Of our current sample, 145 are female and 55 are male with an average age of 20.5 years old. As of today, 95 individuals have broken up with the partner they were dating when they initially enrolled in the study.

Final Survey Information

Many of you will be receiving links to your final UT-DATES survey soon. Although this survey is a bit longer than the bi-weekly surveys, it is probably the greatest in importance. Please make sure you complete this survey as it is quite valuable!

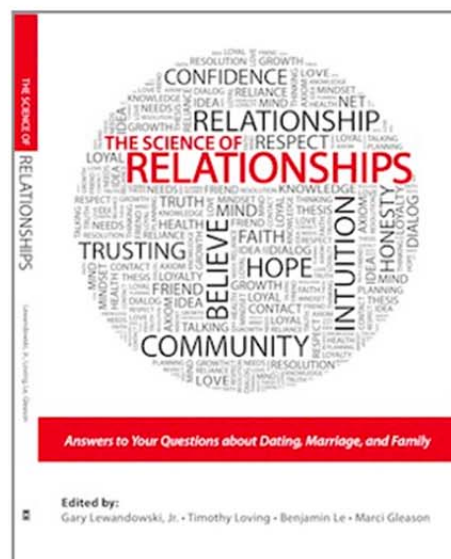
